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THE EASTER ESCAPE ROOM

Your students are on a mission! They are returning to a bustling Jerusalem on the weekend of the Passover. Like most of God's unfolding story, the story of Easter from the Bible contained several mysteries to almost everyone at the time!

Students will be taken back to solve the mysteries of what happened by decoding the facts—so they can **SEE THE LIGHT** of a glorious resurrection!

Students will learn all the surrounding details, such as what led up to this miracle of miracles. If Jesus was not a criminal, why was He arrested and killed? What were some of His last words—to His disciples and to us as well?

IT STARTS COMING TOGETHER ON THE NIGHT BEFORE THE PASSOVER, IN AN UPSTAIRS ROOM BEING USED BY THE DISCIPLES AND JESUS. To discover the LIGHT, students will use ciphers and puzzles.

Each mystery is unique. Some puzzles are easy for younger children; others require guidance or wisdom from older counterparts. The main fun is that the codes require critical thinking to determine what secret lies behind each symbol. Each code will reveal interesting facts about faith in new beginnings. These exercises will keep your students captivated while encouraging friendly competition to crack the final code.

The fun for teachers and parents is the lack of prep. This is a **PRINT AND GO** activity requiring little else! Enjoy solving the codes with the kids without cutting, pasting, and problem-solving beforehand.

The best age range for our ESCAPE ROOMS is 8 and up. Younger students can still participate, but they may need some help.

The escape room package includes:

- Teacher Instructions
- Student Instructions
- Four Mysteries
- Four Decoders
- One Final Challenge
- Keys to the Kingdom (Prizes)
- Answer Key

The objective of our ESCAPE ROOM is to read and solve the four mysteries and complete the final challenge in the time allotted, and thereby earn a key.



TEACHER INSTRUCTIONS

1. Students can complete the escape room alone, in partners, or teams. If you have a child younger than 8, we suggest they are paired with an older teammate.
2. Print out the 4 mysteries and final challenge for each student/team to fill in (pages 6-9).
3. Print out the 4 “decoders” (pages 12-15) and either spread them out so kids can view them as needed or hang them on the walls. Make sure they are placed where several students can congregate at once if needed.
4. Tell students they have [you decide] minutes to solve the 4 mysteries by decoding the answers, answering the multiple-choice questions, and figuring out the final 4-digit code. Between 30 and 60 minutes usually works well, depending on the age and ability of students.
5. Students can solve the mysteries in ANY order. Encourage them by saying, “If you get stuck, just move on and come back to the tricky one later.”

Note: The first time students see the codes, they may find them a bit confounding. That’s okay! Let them exercise their clue-solving skills independently for a bit before you jump in to help them.

6. Students will not be able to figure out the final code without reading through each mystery.
7. After all mysteries are solved and decoded, the four-digit code is cracked, and the Final Challenge is complete, give out prizes (keys). One key (symbolic to the keys to the Kingdom) should be given to each child involved in finding the solutions.
8. If time permits, review the answers to the Final Challenge to help reinforce the material.

SOLVE THE MYSTERIES OF EASTER

Our Bible is filled with sound wisdom, great advice . . . and **BIG MYSTERIES THAT NEED SOLVING!**

Here is where you come in. Today we will be solving four mysteries that have to do with **THE RESURRECTION OF JESUS**. These are found in the following places in the Bible:

- Luke 22 (arrest and trial of Jesus)
- John 19 (the crucifixion of Jesus)
- John 20 (story of the resurrection)
- John 11:25-26; 1 Corinthians 15:21 (meaning of the resurrection)

Your teacher may want you to read these passages before you begin. Be sure to ask!

THE 1ST MYSTERY: WHY DID A DISCIPLE BETRAY JESUS?

THE 2ND MYSTERY: HOW DID THE WORLD'S MOST INNOCENT MAN GET A DEATH SENTENCE?

THE 3RD MYSTERY: WHAT DID JESUS HAVE TO SAY TO US?

THE 4TH MYSTERY: DID MIRACLES REALLY HAPPEN, ONE AFTER ANOTHER?

YOUR MISSION: SHED LIGHT ON THE MYSTERIES

Jesus said “YOU ARE THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD.” It is our job to understand God’s word so we can defend it!

THE MYSTERIES: Mysteries #1, #2, #3, and #4 will introduce you to people, places, and things in the context of the Bible. Each mystery will raise a question you need to answer.

THE DECODER: Visit the decoder for each mystery and SHED YOUR LIGHT (solve the mystery)!

THE KEY: Once you have solved ALL FOUR MYSTERIES using each one’s DECODER, you must take one final step and earn the KEY. This KEY is a symbol of the KEYS TO THE KINGDOM OF HEAVEN! In order to earn the key, you must decipher the four numbers needed on the four-digit code page.

When you have SHED LIGHT on the four MYSTERIES and obtained the four-digit KEY CODE, you will be given your symbolic KEY TO THE KINGDOM OF HEAVEN!

GO FORTH, SHEDDING LIGHT TO A WORLD FILLED WITH DARKNESS, OBTAINING KEYS TO THE KINGDOM!



MYSTERY #1:

WHY WOULD A DISCIPLE BETRAY JESUS?

It was Thursday night, the Last Supper, the night of Jesus' arrest and the night before His crucifixion. Jesus said that one of His disciples would betray Him. But why? Let's go back and see... .

1. The Bible doesn't tell us when Judas Iscariot came to be a disciple of Jesus. Judas was the only disciple who hailed from southern Judea. The rest were from Galilee.
2. Judas served as treasurer for the disciples and carried their money box. He is known to have robbed it a few times (John 12:6).
3. Once Mary, sister of Lazarus, poured expensive perfume over Jesus' feet. Judas objected, saying the perfume was expensive and could have been sold to feed the poor. However, he really said it because he was disappointed; he wouldn't get some of the money.
4. Shortly after this, Judas went to the chief priests who had been looking for a way to kill Jesus. They were greedy and afraid Jesus' popularity meant they would be put out of power.
5. Judas asked, "What are you willing to give me if I hand him over to you?" They agreed on 30 silver coins. From then on, Judas watched for an opportunity to hand Jesus over.
6. John 13:2 says the devil prompted Judas to betray Jesus at the Last Supper, and verses 26-28 say the devil actually entered Judas when he went to get the soldiers.
7. Judas found them in the garden of Gethsemane. Judas betrayed Jesus with a kiss, showing the soldiers which man to arrest.
8. As Jesus was being led to crucifixion, Judas committed suicide.
9. No one knows Judas' motive for the betrayal. But it's likely he thought Jesus would become a king and powerful military leader, and if he was a disciple he would become famous and powerful also. When Judas found out otherwise, he no longer desired to follow Jesus.

MYSTERY #2:

HOW DID THE WORLD'S MOST INNOCENT MAN GET A DEATH SENTENCE?

Jesus was arrested in the Garden of Gethsemane after Judas betrayed Him. What would the religious leaders accuse Jesus of, when he had done nothing but teach love and wisdom, and healed hundreds of people? Jesus had even predicted His followers would scatter at His arrest. He was right! Let's see what happened on that dark and fateful night.

1. Jesus stood trial in four places. The first was the dwelling of Annas. Annas was appointed high priest of the Jerusalem temple around AD 6. His son-in-law Caiaphas, another high priest who was also there, was involved in the plot to get Jesus killed. The religious leaders they met with were called the Sanhedrin.
2. There, Jesus was accused of a religious crime called blasphemy. Blasphemy is claiming to be the Son of God, the Messiah. The Sanhedrin then sent Jesus to Pontius Pilate, Governor of Judea, because they claimed they were too religious to kill anyone.
3. Pilate was not Jewish and cared nothing for their faith. So he instead charged Jesus with inciting people to riot, forbidding the people to pay their taxes, and claiming to be a king. These accusations twisted Jesus' actions to make Him seem guilty.
4. Pilate found no reason to kill Jesus so he sent Him to Herod Antipas, the tetrarch of Nazareth, who was in Jerusalem to celebrate Passover. Herod didn't want the responsibility. He let his men mock Jesus and make him a spectacle. Jesus was also beaten, then sent back to Pilate.
5. Pilate hoped to please the people by having Jesus scourged—a terrible beating with a whip meant to tear the skin. However, the people weren't satisfied after the scourging.
6. In a final effort to free Jesus, Pilate offered the people a choice to release Jesus or Barnabas. The Jews had a rule that they could let a condemned man go free on Passover. However, the mob was not willing to let Jesus walk free. They chose to let Barabbas go and to crucify Jesus.
7. A riot was breaking out. So Pilate took water and washed his hands, saying to the crowd, "I am innocent of this man's blood. You bear the responsibility." All the people answered, "His blood be on us and on our children!" That is astonishing considering Jesus was about to be a blood sacrifice for the sins of mankind, unbeknownst to anyone but himself.
8. Pilate's wife was a believer. She tried to dissuade him from giving the death sentence, stating Jesus had been in her dreams the night before and it was disturbing. However, Pilate couldn't control the mob and gave in to them.

MYSTERY #3:

WHAT DID JESUS HAVE TO SAY TO ALL OF US?

Rome was about to crucify an innocent man, sent by corrupt religious leaders. But God makes good out of the worst of things. He had plans to show His love in the end. Let's go to where Jesus was crucified. He said some things to his Father and to those around him, and they remain relevant today.

1. Jesus hung on the cross for three hours. His first words were, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do" (Luke 23:34). We often don't realize the great amount of pain He was in, yet He was still able to feel compassion for mankind. When we feel like being unkind or rude, we should remember this amazing example of love.
2. Jesus was crucified between two criminals. One said Jesus should get them down. The other was very sorry for his wrongdoings and asked Jesus to speak to God on his behalf. Jesus said, "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in paradise" (Luke 23:43).
3. John was the only disciple known to come to the crucifixion. All the others scattered, afraid of what would happen to them if they were discovered as Jesus' followers. Jesus told John to take care of His mother. This showed that Jesus' half-brothers, born to Joseph and Mary after him, were not yet believers. His half-brothers, James and Jude, later converted and became leaders of the early church. One of the most mysterious statements was Jesus saying, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Matthew 27:46, Mark 15:34). This was when Jesus actually took on our sins to become the sacrifice for them.
4. John 19:28 notes Jesus saying, "I thirst." He had lost a lot of blood and had become dehydrated while walking to the place of the crucifixion and carrying His cross part of the way. They gave Him vinegar to drink.
5. "It is finished," Jesus said toward the hour of His death (John 19:30). This meant He had become the sacrifice for our sins. Jesus was saying that His task was over and the sacrifice was complete.
6. As His last words, Jesus cried out loudly, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit" (Luke 23:46). He had spent 33 years living on earth and was ready to rejoin His Father in heaven.
7. Jesus died around 3 p.m. having been on the cross for three hours.

MYSTERY #4:

WAS IT REALLY ONE MIRACLE AFTER THE OTHER?

Jesus referred to His death as the dark hour. But as soon as He died, things began to change. Miracles began to occur! Let's go back to that Good Friday and watch what transpired...

1. The first thing people noticed was that it was getting dark. At three in the afternoon, there was no reason for this. Some people began to worry about what they had done to Jesus, and that perhaps He was who He claimed to be (Matthew 27:45).
2. At the very moment that Jesus breathed His last breath, the Temple's veil that covered the entrance to the Holy of Holies was torn in two from top to bottom (Matthew 27:51). This symbolized that there was no longer a veil between mankind and God. We can speak to Him freely now as followers of Jesus.
3. "The earth shook and the rocks split" (Matthew 27:51). The soldier who had been guarding Jesus saw the earthquake. He was terrified and exclaimed, "Surely he was the Son of God!" (v. 54).
4. The bodies of many holy people who had died were raised to life. They came out of the tombs after Jesus' resurrection and went into the holy city and appeared to many people. (Matthew 27: 52-53). The dead arose when Jesus died to show us that one day we will rise from the grave also when He comes again.
5. Saturday was a quiet day. But Sunday, Jesus' good friend Mary Magdalene went to His tomb to take care of His body. She found the tomb empty and ran to tell the disciples in hiding. Simon and Peter ran to also find the tomb empty.
6. Jesus appeared first to Mary Magdalene, who at first thought He was the gardener, probably because her tears blinded her. She tried to hug Him and He said not to, because He hadn't yet ascended to the Father.
7. Jesus appeared to the disciples multiple times as the risen Lord. He ate food with them, appeared to walk through a wall and through a locked door. He may have looked different but still had His wounds from the crucifixion. The Apostle Thomas refused to believe until he touched them.
8. Jesus appeared to around 500 people between Resurrection Sunday and the Ascension 40 days later. It is recorded in 1 Corinthians 15:6.
